Use of a Bunsen Burner

When lighting a Bunsen burner the air hole should be <u>closed</u> or very slightly <u>open</u>.

When the air hole is closed the flame is <u>yellow</u> in colour. This is called the **safety flame** because it is clearly visible.

When a Bunsen is not used for heating something it should be turned to the safety flame.

If heating liquids in a test tube with a Bunsen:

- have the air hole half open (blue flame) and NEVER fill the test tubes more than $\frac{1}{4}$ full.
- If heating solids in a test tube with a Bunsen:
 - turn the air hole fully open.
